After graduating from college, Jon worked construction and played drums in a Boston band, earning his Masters in Environmental Education along the way. He moved to San Francisco and ran a Bay Area recycler's environmental education department. In off hours, he and childhood friend, Chanin Cook began building furniture, first to fill their apartment and then by client request.

As their pieces grew in scale, Jon and Chanin needed space and made the move north to Napa. 11 years later, their design/build furniture business - Chajo - is known among designers, architects and private clients, for its clean, contemporary forms and striking materials. Largely self-taught in all disciplines, Jon does all metalwork, woodwork and stonework in the Chajo shop. And in his off hours, Jon practices his other passion -- environmental education - in a weekly afterschool program for elementary students.
